 - Information to parents (educational services; therapies; etc)

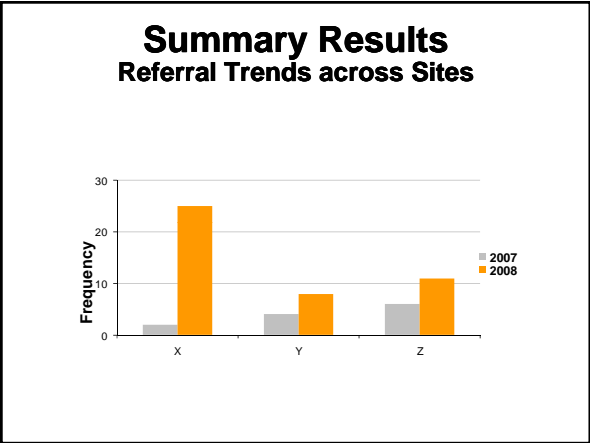
Model
