

You have the power to prevent some cancers in your children.

- Each year in the U.S. there are 26,000 cancer cases that could be prevented with human papillomavirus (HPV) vaccine.
- HPV vaccine can prevent 9 strains of cancer.
- Two doses of HPV vaccine should be given at least 6 months apart to adolescents aged 11-12 years before exposure to the virus. Teens and adults, ages 15-26, will need three doses of HPV vaccine.
- HPV vaccine costs are covered under most insurance programs, Medicaid, and the Vaccines for Children Program (VFC).
