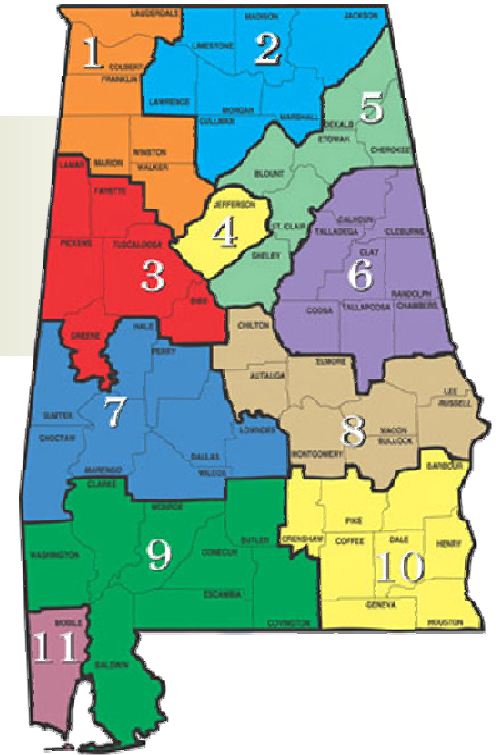


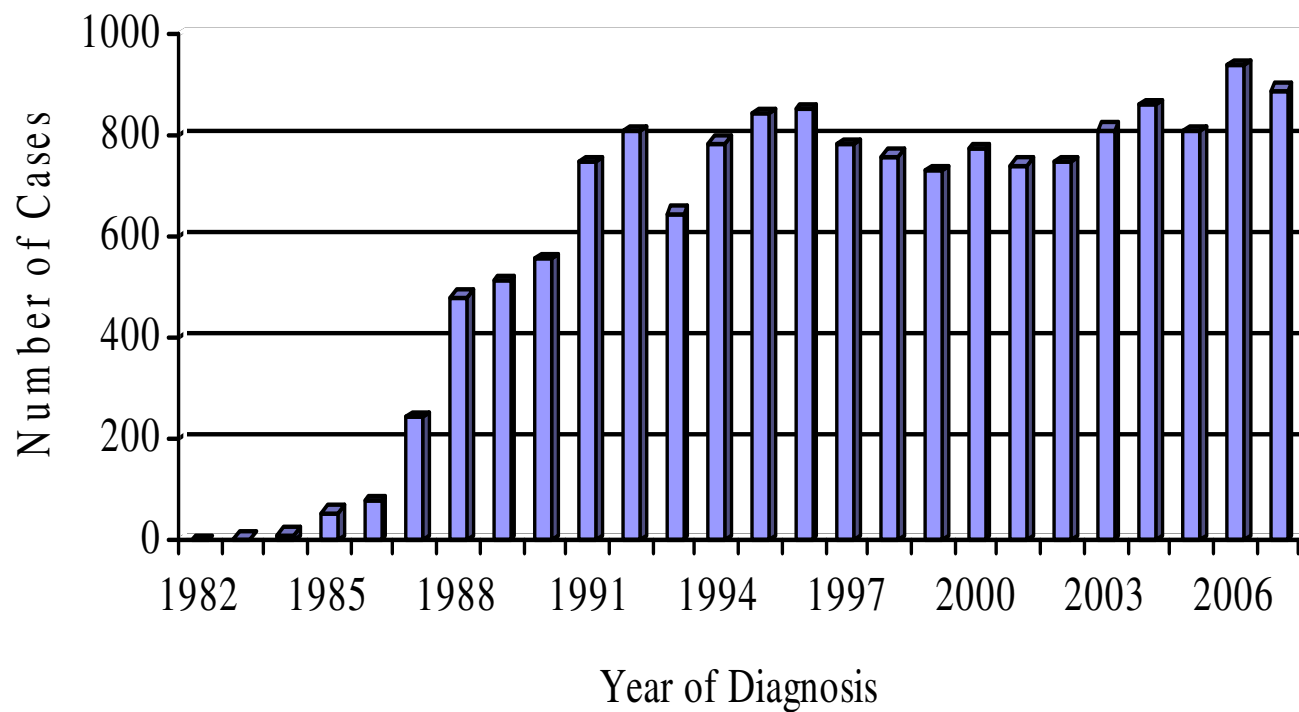

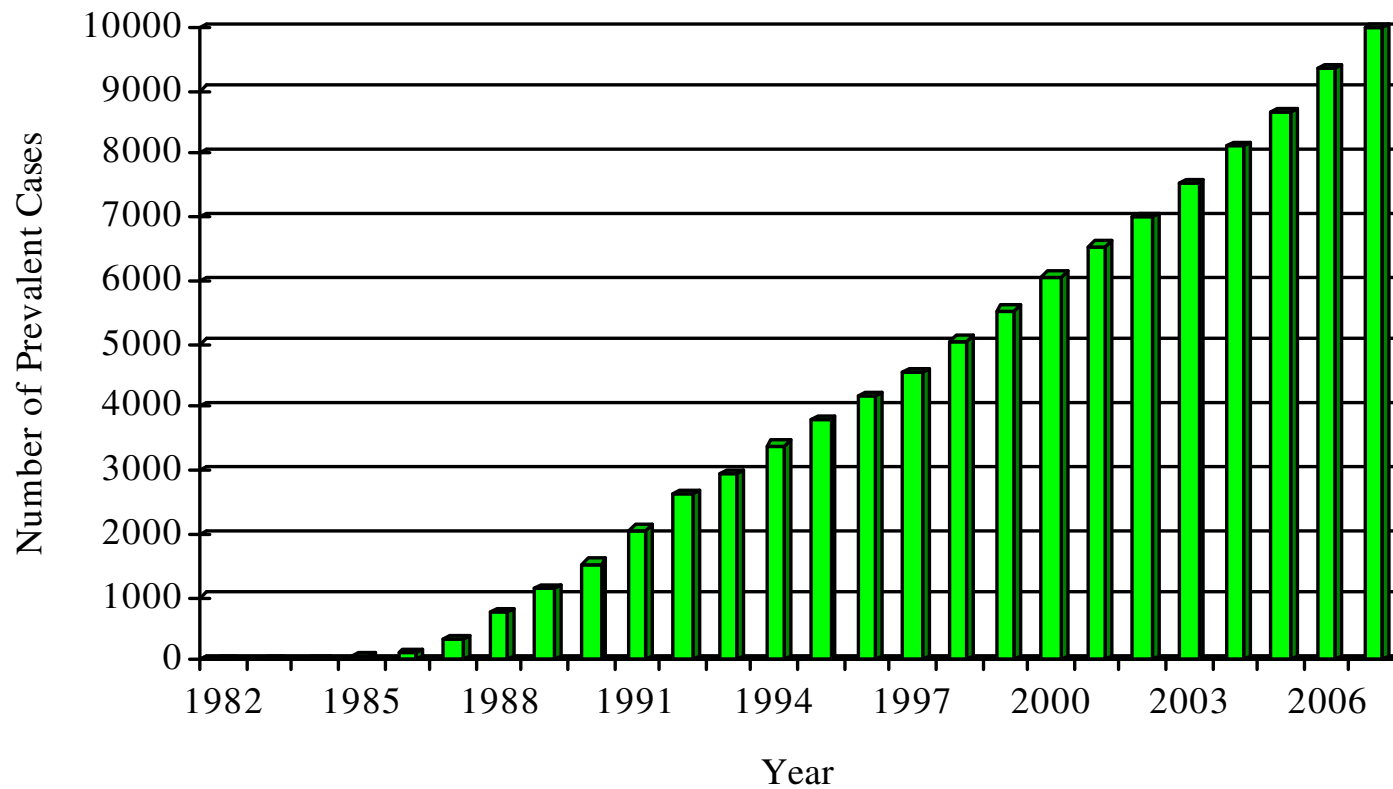
# Recent Increase in HIV/AIDS Cases

- From January 1, 2007-December 31, 2007, **890** HIV/AIDS cases were reported to the HIV/AIDS Surveillance Branch.
- This is the 2<sup>nd</sup> highest annual total of HIV/AIDS cases ever reported in Alabama.
- The highest total was **934** HIV/AIDS cases diagnosed in 2006.

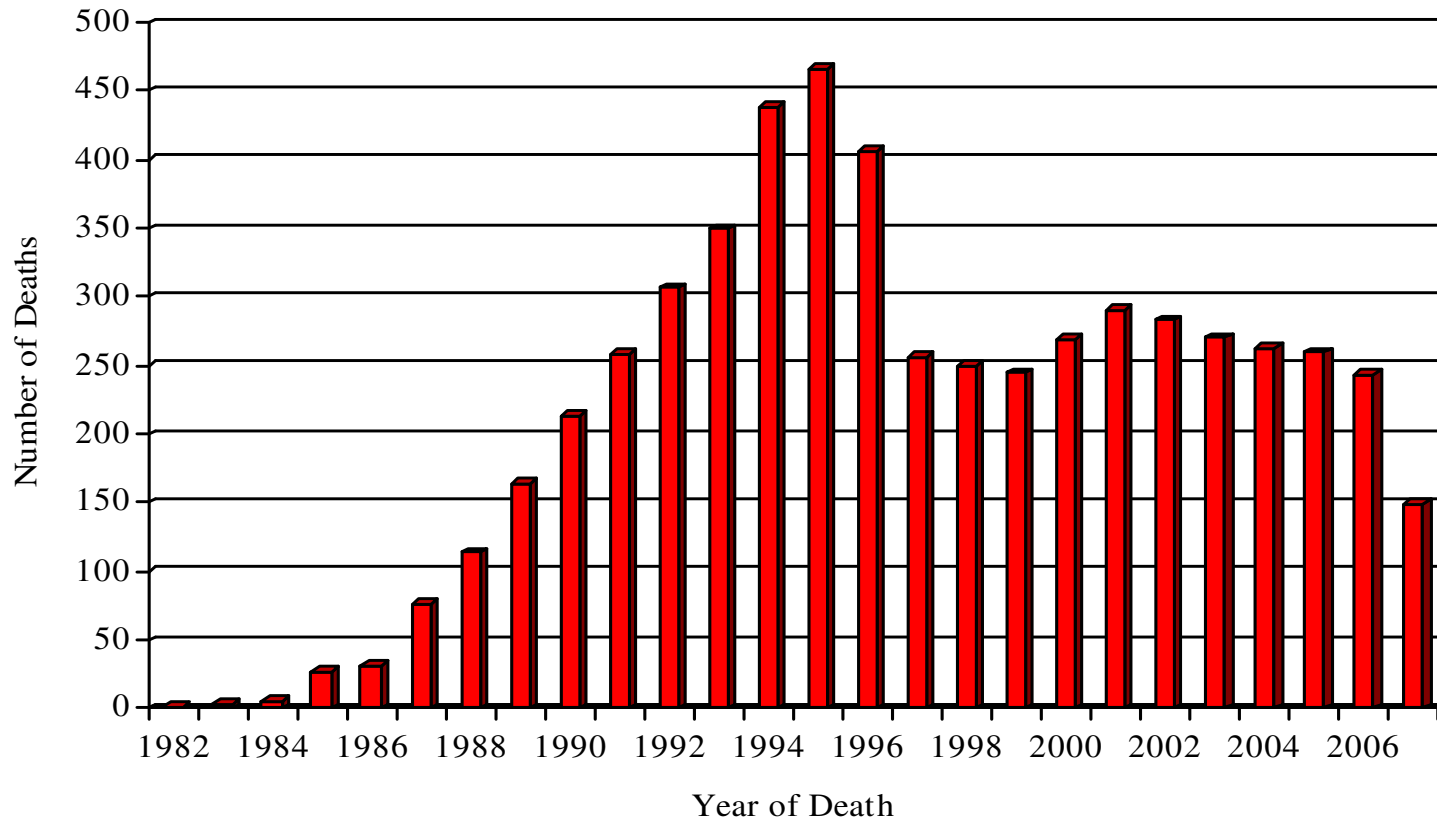
# HIV/AIDS Cases by Year of Diagnosis, Alabama 1982-2007



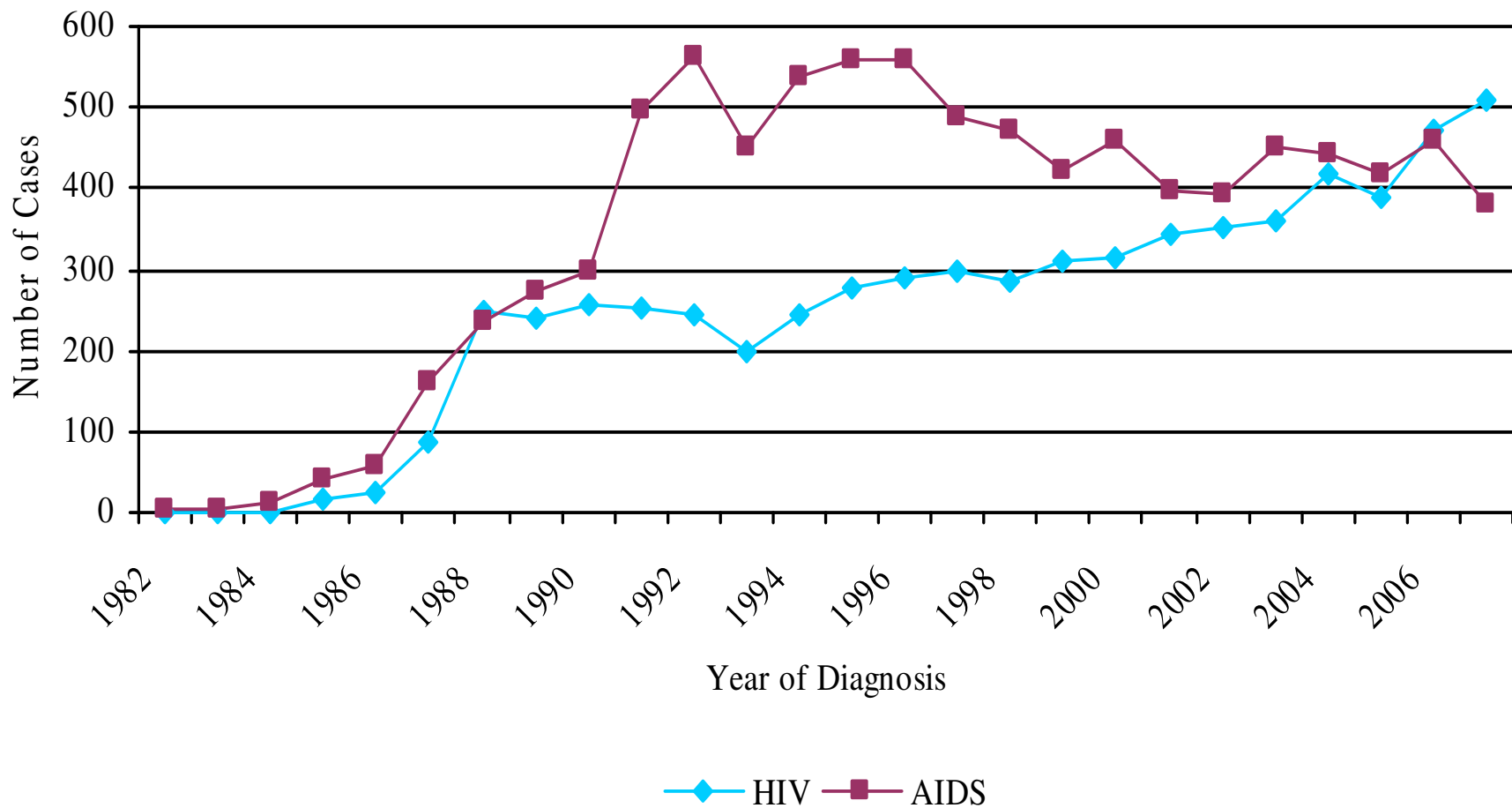
# Alabama Prevalent HIV/AIDS cases as of December 31, 2007



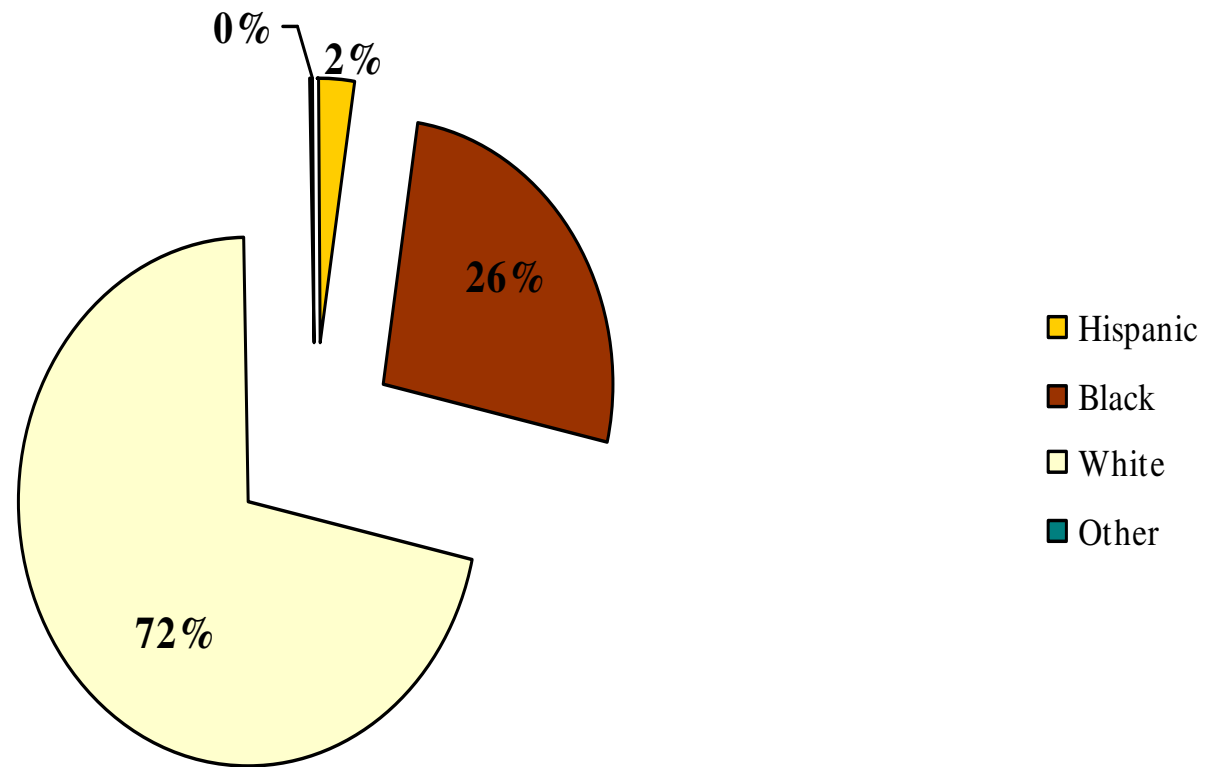
# Deaths of AL Residents with HIV/AIDS by Year of Death as of 12/07



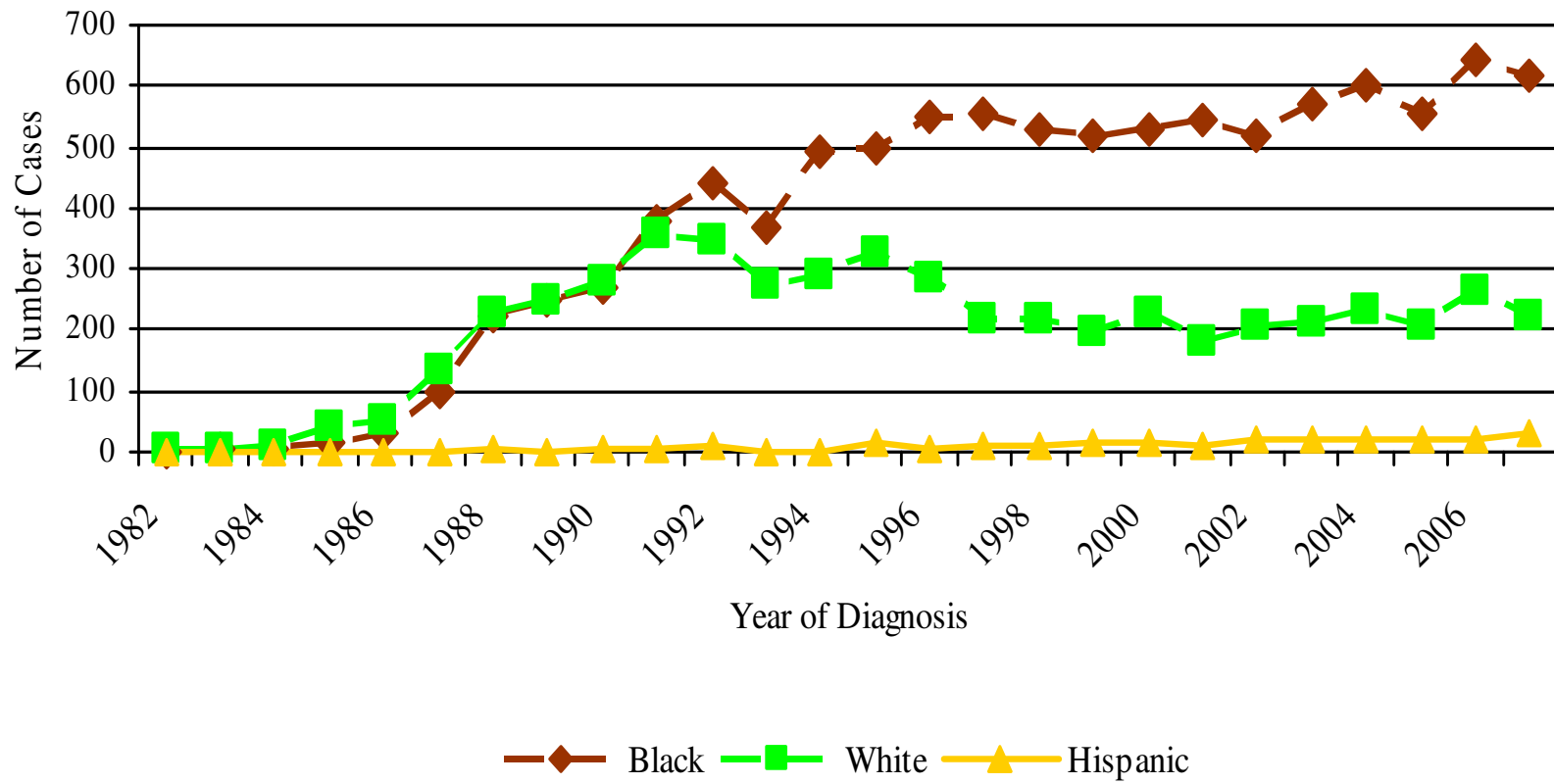
# HIV/AIDS Cases by Disease Status & Year of Diagnosis AL 1982-2007



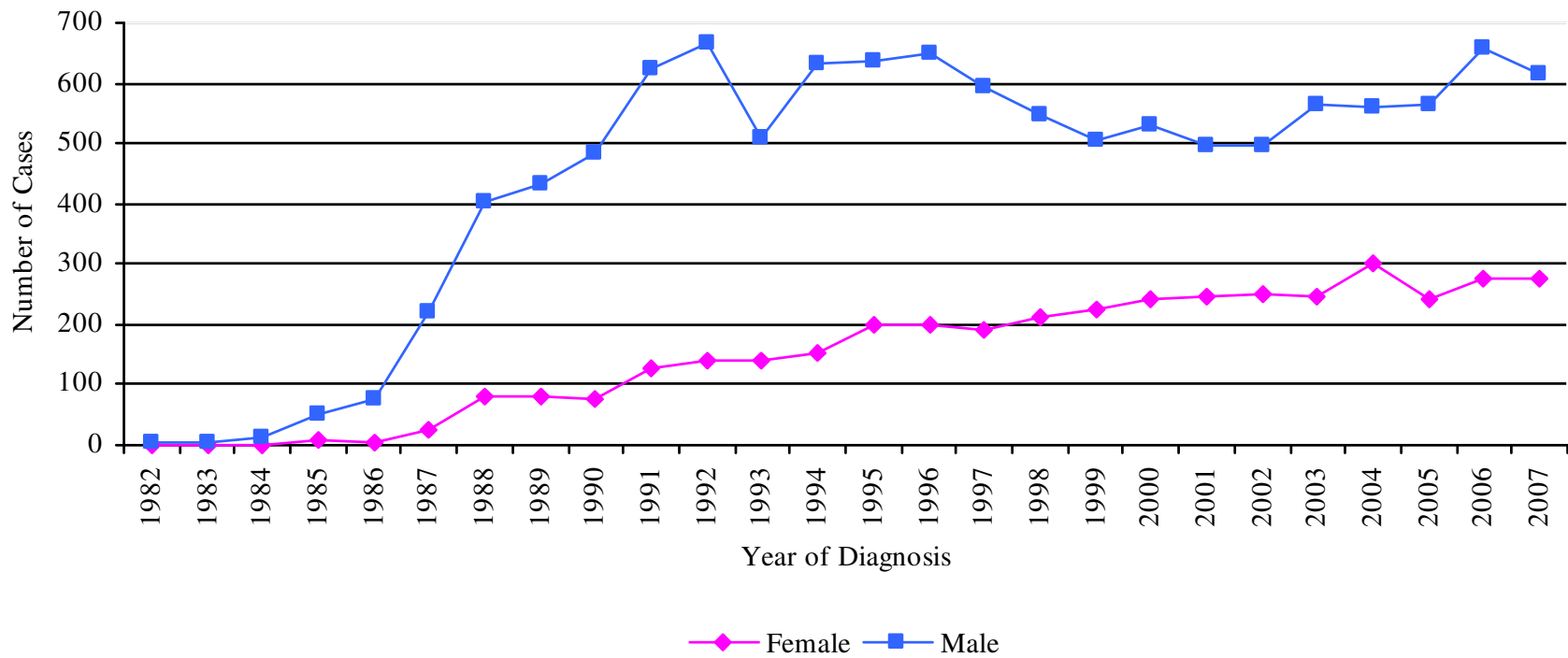
# Alabama's 2006 Population Estimate

# HIV/AIDS Cases by Gender & Year of Diagnosis, AL 1982-2007



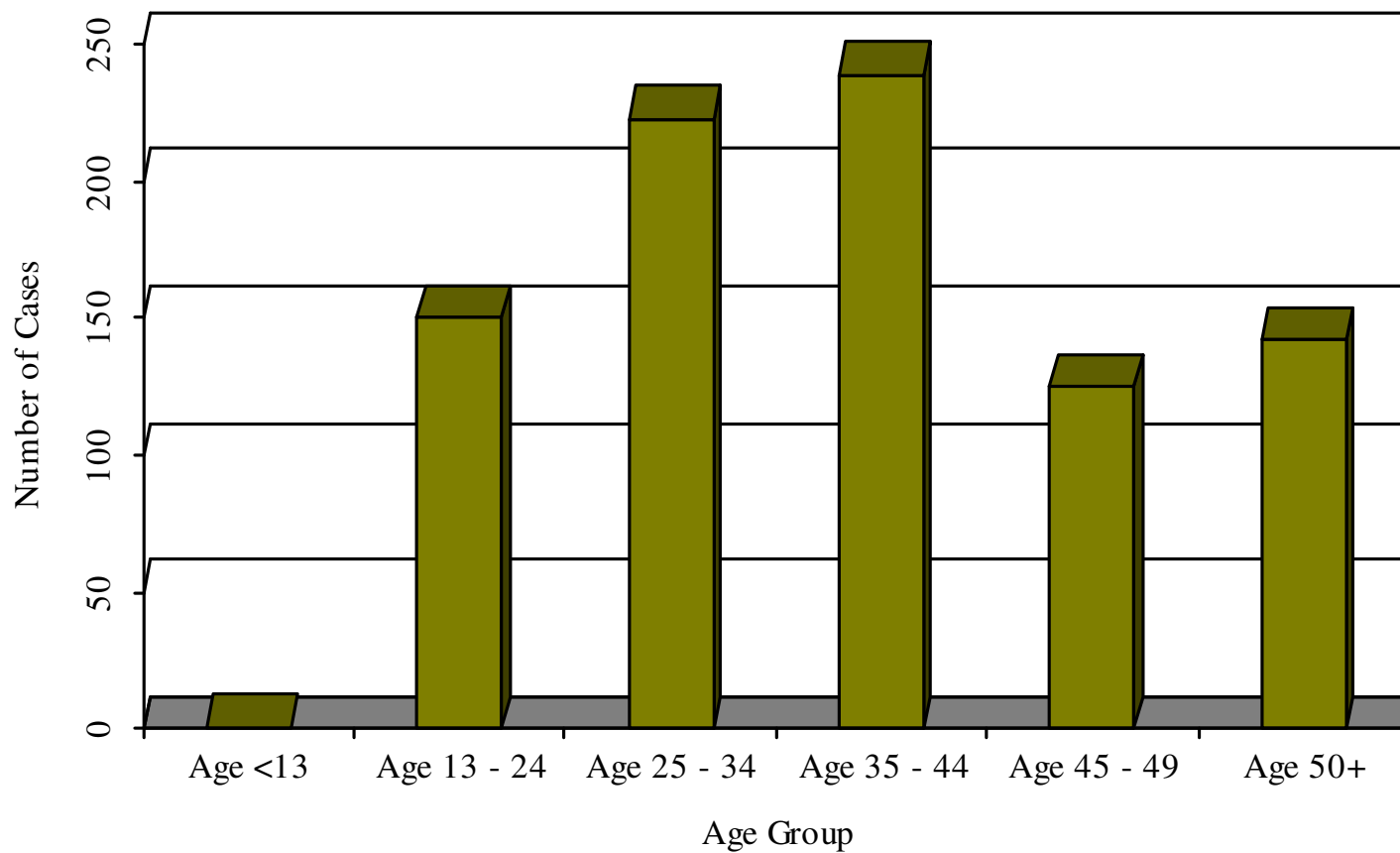

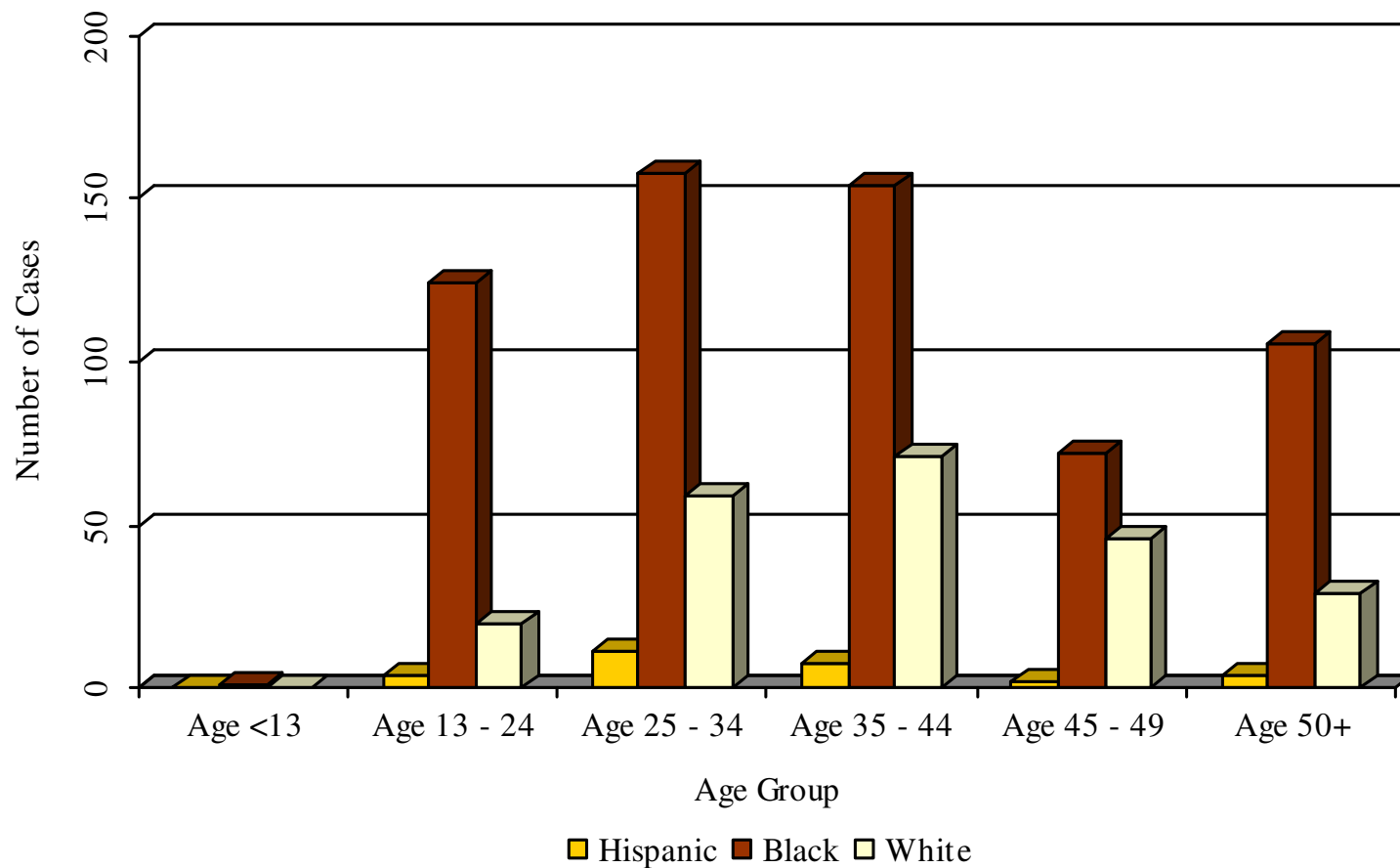

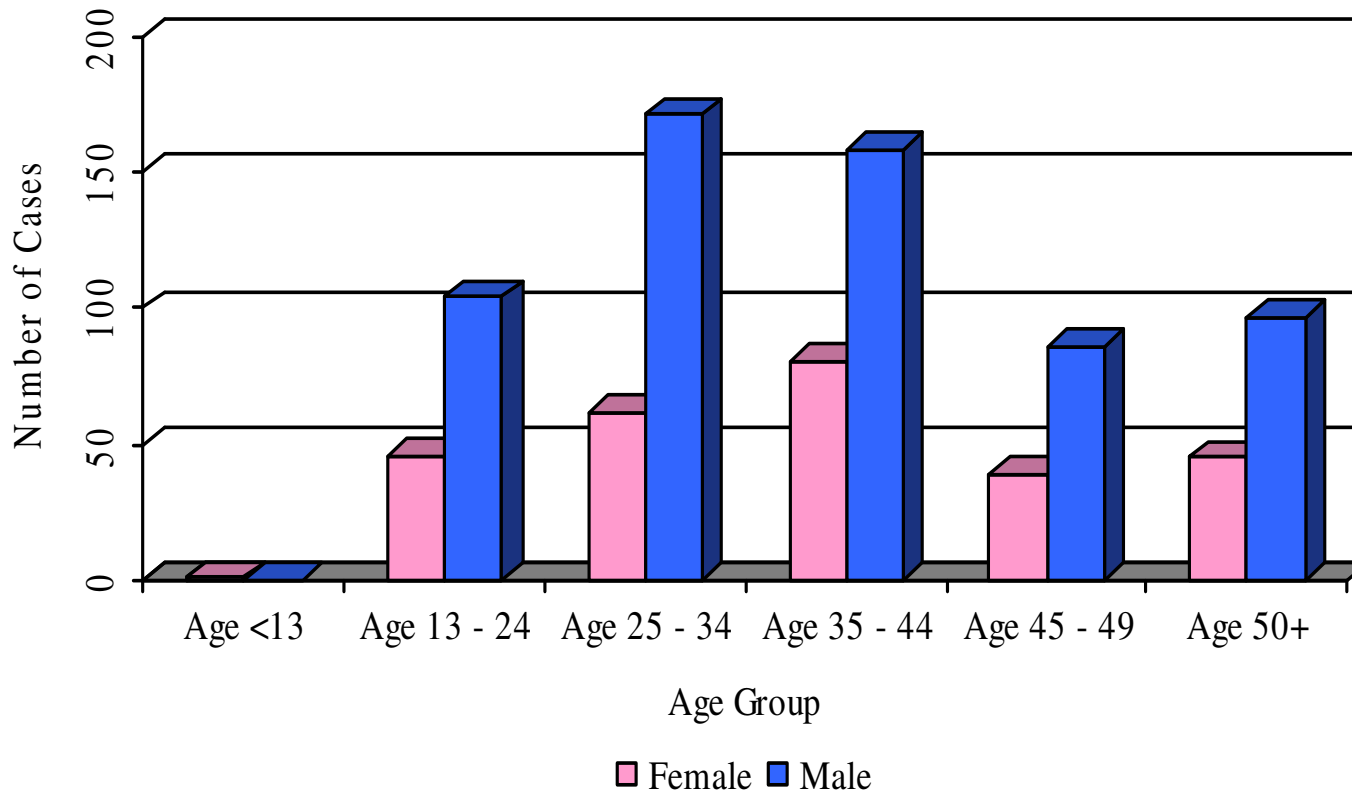
# HIV/AIDS Cases by Age Group, AL January 1, 2007-December 31, 2007

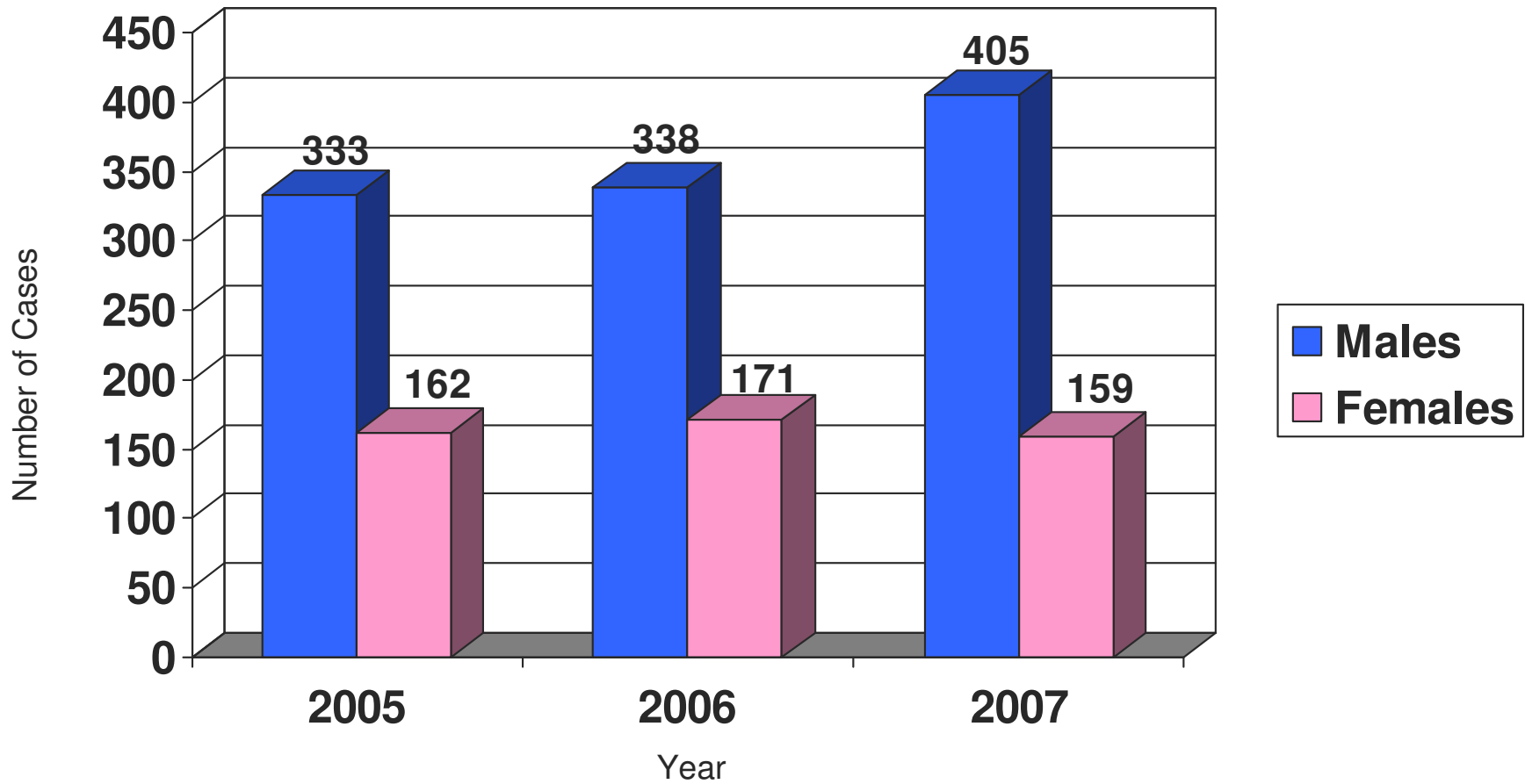

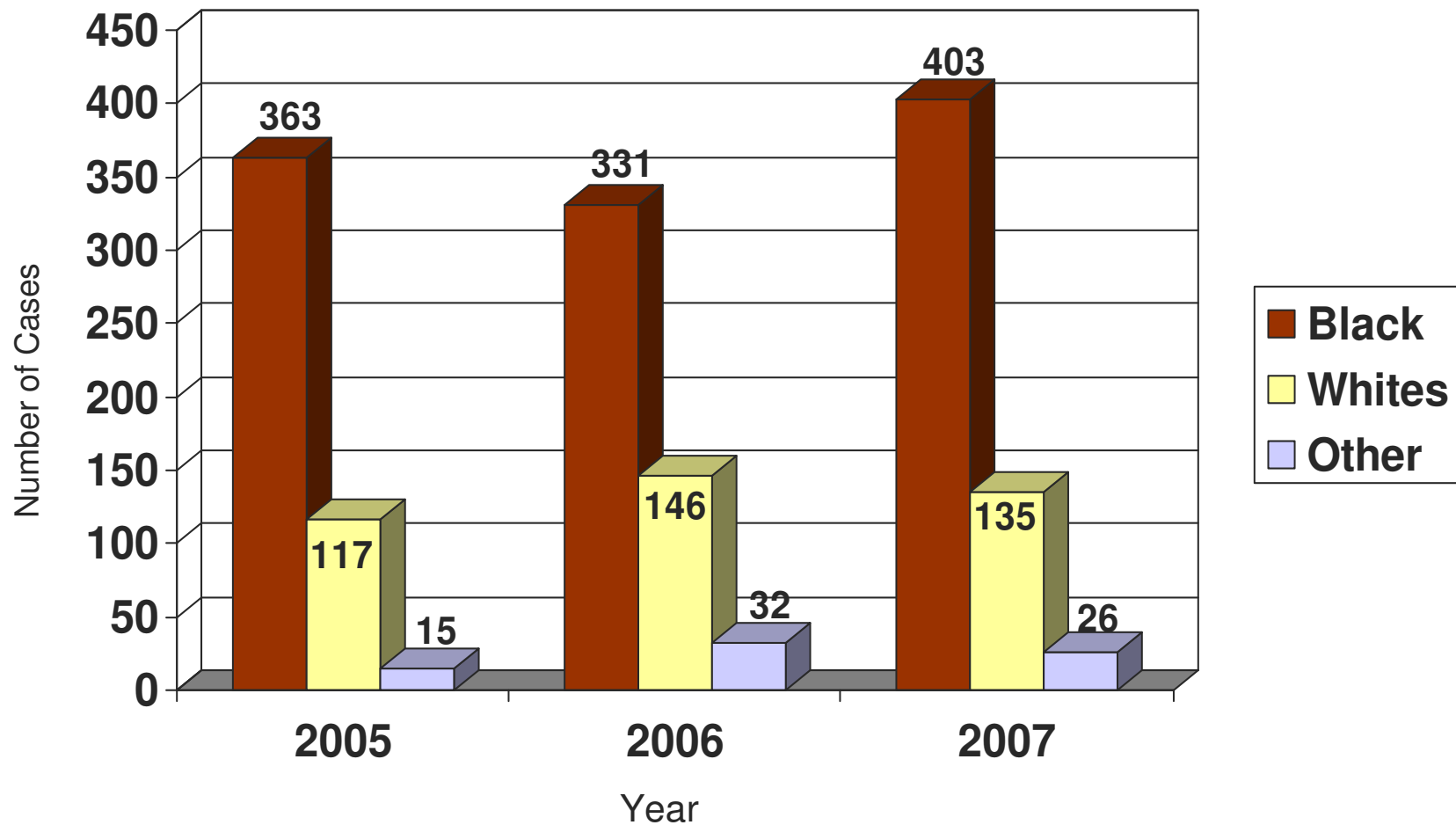
# Enhanced Referral Tracking System

- Alabama is recognized as the only state tracking newly diagnosed HIV cases & linking them into care.
- HIV Coordinators are the field staff that track and report the information obtained.
- Piloting in mid 2004, then implementing in start of 2005, ADPH has collaborated with various resources to link clients into care.

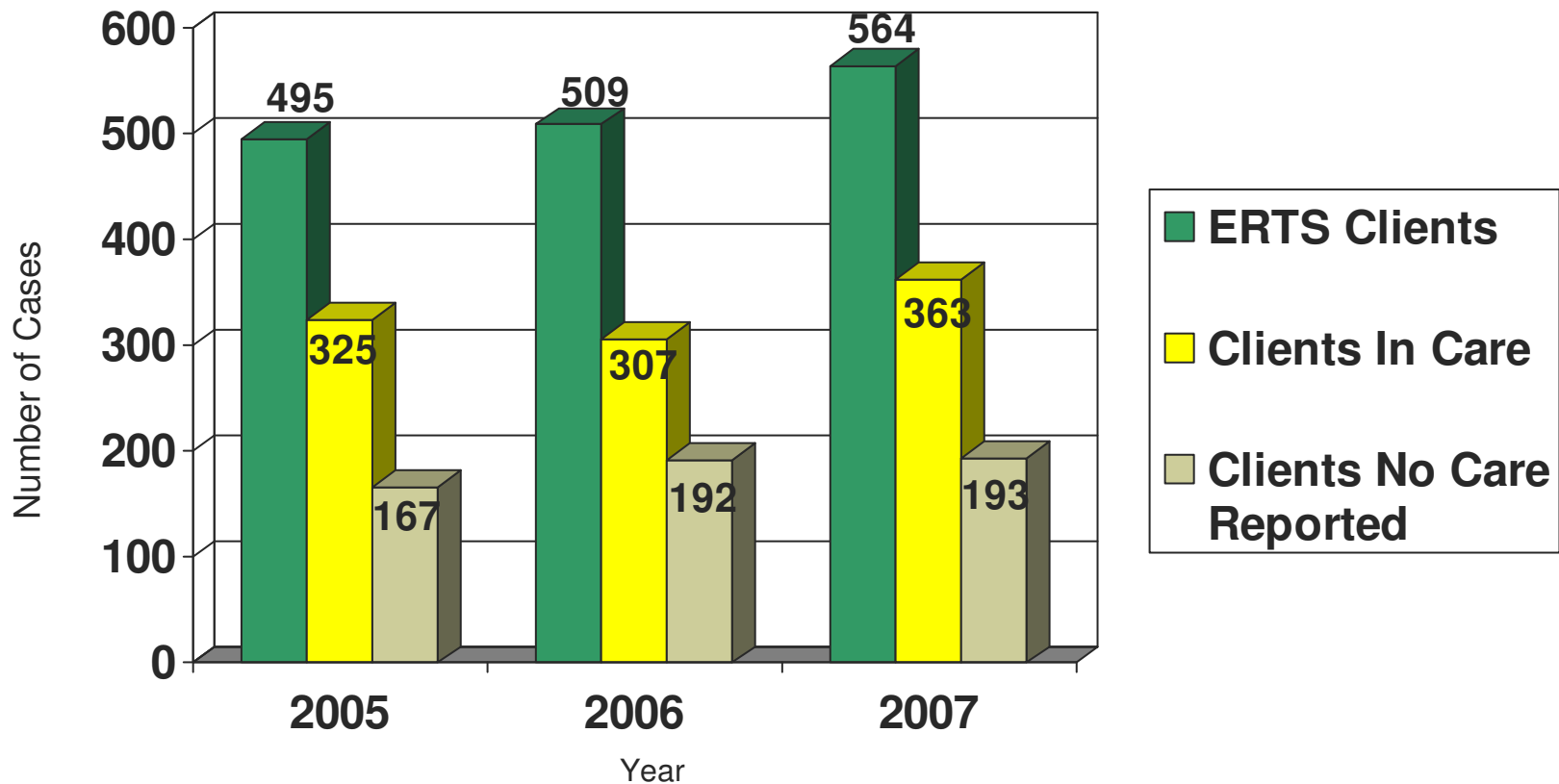
# [ ERTS Cases by Gender ]
