

Prevention and Control Measures: Respiratory Syncytial Virus (RSV)

Transmission:

- RSV can be spread from close contact with mouth or nose secretions from an infected person, even before signs or symptoms appear.
- The virus can also live on surfaces for many hours and be a source of infection.

Prevention and Control Measures:

- Always cover your mouth with a tissue when coughing or sneezing. Cough or sneeze into your upper sleeve or elbow, if you do not have a tissue available.
- Dispose of used facial tissues that contain nasal secretions.
- Avoid touching your face with unwashed hands.
- Practice proper <u>hand washing hygiene</u>.
- Avoid close contact, such as sharing cups or eating utensils, with someone who has RSV.
- If possible, stay home from work, school or public areas when sick so that others are protected from catching your illness.
- Clean and disinfect frequently touched surfaces or common areas with 1:10 parts bleach
 and water solution. Allow the solution to sit for 10 minutes before wiping away.
